THE BRIDEWELL

This former model prison built in 1785 to the plans of John Howard, prison reformer, is a nationally important Grade II listed building. The Wymondham Heritage Society negotiated the acquisition of the building and set up the Wymondham Bridewell Preservation Trust to purchase and manage it. It was converted to contain six community projects, including the Museum, whilst retaining its essential character.
